- Although Simon is very enthusiastic and is a good speaker, It was difficult to learn some concepts. I found that his lecture slides had insufficient text to follow what he was conveying. There were too many illustrations, graphs, examples with little text to completely understand the ideas he was trying to convey. This made revision difficult as often it becomes a challenge to see what to 'take home' from the lecture. Furthermore I found that he did not draw attention to the important aspects/concepts of his material. Sometimes I could understand the example he was using but I was confused as to how this was related and relevant to the course. The main concepts that one should take from a lecture was poorly highlighted.
- 8 Great lecturing style. Great use of technology.
- I found the concepts and ideas that we developed very interesting, however, being new to programming I found it very difficult as to how to incorportate these into NetLogo. For the amount of credit given to our assignments (55%) I felt that there were unreasonable expectations of what we were capable of in NetLogo.
- A very enthusiastic lecturer, who is very interested in the material that he is presenting which encourages the same engagement in the students. My attention was constantly engaged in the lecture, and I attribute this to the lecturing style (as I am easily distracted in lectures). Although the lecture material was often difficult, Simon managed to clear up all tricky concepts. Easily the best lecturer encountered at the university so far.
- 11 Considering it was the first run of the unit everything was very coherent and organised. Such a broad field and yet a number of important areas were introduced such that agent based modeling and complex systems were shown in a good light.
